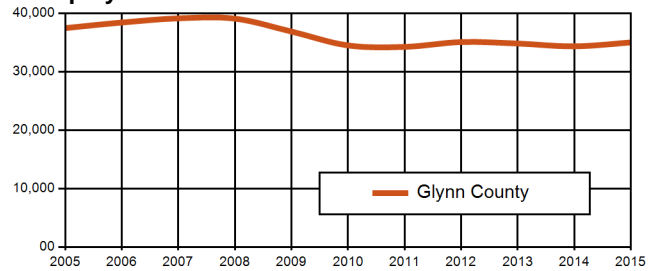

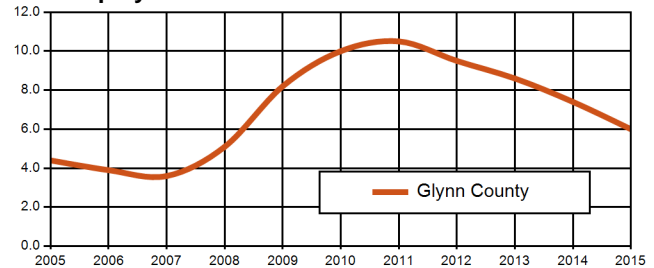

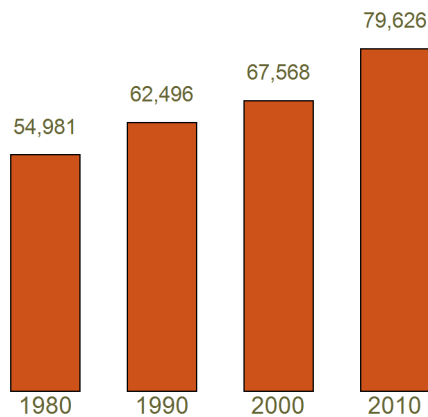

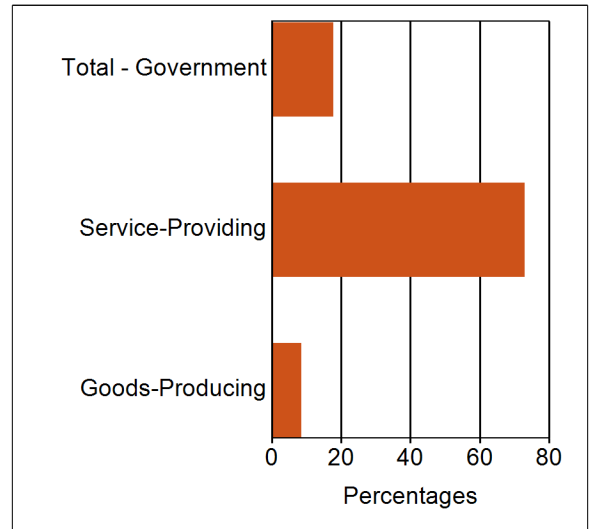
## Glynn Per Capita Income
